



Properly Sizing an Image for Printing

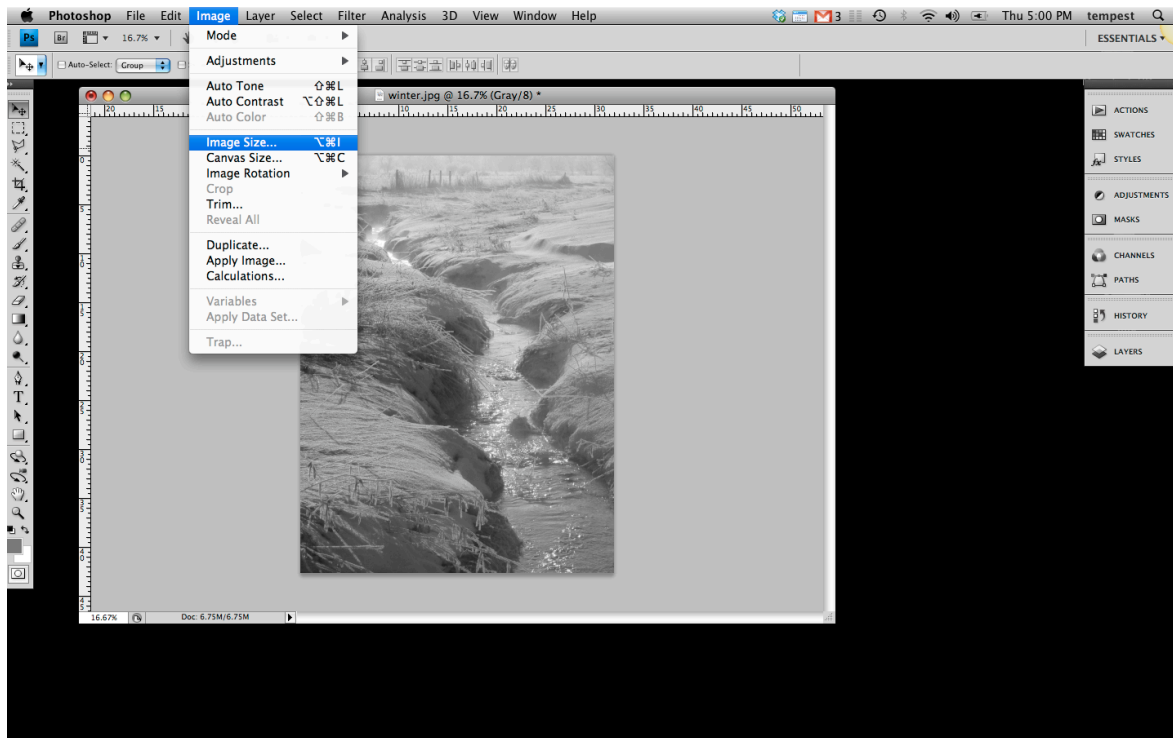

INTRODUCTION

Duckrabbit asks that your images be sized between 300-360ppi (pixels-per-inch). This gives enough information to allow the image to print clearly, while not being so saturated with pixels that the file becomes an unwieldily size. You'll want to make sure that you choose the 'save-as' option after sizing your file so that you don't over-write your original image. This ensures that you still are able to size-up your image using the original file if you ever want a larger print.

SIZING

In the menu, go to image >image size



Make sure that the 'constrain proportions' box is checked.

Under 'resolution', type in 300 and make sure that the pixels/inch selection is made to it's right. Above that, make sure that the sizing is being measured in 'inches', then type in the width or height that you want your image printed at. The other side should automatically adjust.

Click 'Ok'.
